

Memorise these points and you'll get better 'Snaps'

YOUR best snapshots will be those taken in brilliant sunshine when you can give "Instantaneous" exposures. When the light is dull or your subject in deep shadows, use a tripod or similar support for your camera, and givea "Time" exposure—an "Instantaneous" picture would be under-exposed.

It is always better to give a little too much

Always try to select the best view point, and get the best composition into your picture—it makes all the difference.

90 per cent of your pictures will probably be made of your friends. Do not put them in front of brick walls, as though they were going to be shot—select a nice background.

Try to get the sun at your right, or at your left. Never have it directly in front. Avoid having it directly behind—this tends to make your pictures dull and lacking in contrast.

Be sure all your subject is included in the finder.

Hold the camera firmly, and level.

Press the shutter gently.
